### ELIGIBILITY FOR THE COURSE

Minimum educational qualifications will be Matriculation and Divisional with science or its equivalent qualifications for Diploma (Foresters) and Certificate (Forest Guards) candidates at the time of admission from the Punjab Forest Department shall be between 18 to 23 years of age for

## INTRODUCTION

There are two forestry schools namely, (i) Punjab Forest School Ghoragali and (ii) Punjab Forest School Bahawalpur which impart training & education at sub-professional level in the field of forestry and allied disciplines in the Punjab. These forestry schools offer two courses, one for Foresters (Diploma course) and the other for Forest Guards (Certificate course). The aim of these courses is to produce technically sound foresters who may be able to carry out all the works in the field. The duration of the courses is two years for Foresters (Diploma course) and one year for Forest Guards (Certificate course). Each school is headed by a Principal, who is under the administrative control of the Director, Punjab Forestry Research Institute, Gatwala, Faisalabad. The over all control rests with the chief Conservator of Forests, (P&E) Pb. Central Zone, Lahore who is the final authority for the approval of syllabi and other administrative and disciplinary matters of the schools regarding training.

## ELIGIBILITY FOR THE COURSE

Minimum educational qualifications will be Matriculation (2nd Division) with science or its equivalent qualification both for Diploma (Foresters) and Certificate (Forest Guards) Courses.

Candidates at the time of admission from the Punjab Forest Department must be between 18 to 23 years of age for Foresters and 18 to 24 for Forest Guards.

Candidates should be physically strong and those from the Punjab Forest Department should possess the minimum physical measurements of 5 ft. and 6 inches height and 32-34 inches breast.

Candidates from the Punjab Forest Department fulfilling the above basic requirements shall have to undergo and qualify the following written and physical tests before their final selection by the competent deputing agencies:-

To qualify this test, candidates for Diploma Course will be required to obtain minimum of 40% marks in each subject/item as well as in aggregate, whereas, for Certificate Course, at least 33% marks in each subject/item as well as in aggregate will be necessary.

- 5 The following can be admitted to the School:
- 5.1 Persons deputed by the Punjab Forest Department/  
other Government Departments or autonomous/semi-  
autonomous bodies who fulfil the eligibility  
conditions 2.1 to 2.4 above.
- 5.2 Persons deputed by the Provincial Governments of Sindh  
Baluchistan, N.W.F.P, Azad Kashmir and other Adminis-  
trative units, autonomous/semi-autonomous bodies under  
their administrative control should fulfil the condi-  
tions of eligibility as mentioned above.
- 5.3 Candidates to the school will be nominated by various  
Circles/Divisions/Agencies in accordance with the number  
of seats allotted to them by the Chief Conservator of  
Forests, P&E, Punjab Central Zone, Lahore.
- 6 Candidates from the Punjab Forest Department will fill-  
in a bond for Rs. 20,000 in case of Foresters and Rs.  
10,000 in case of Forest Guards, for successfully  
completing the course and for serving the Department  
for a minimum period of 5 years after the successful  
completion of the course. In case of failure to conform  
with these provisions, the candidate would liable to  
pay the amount of the bond in accordance with the terms  
of the bond. This will be in addition to losing the job.

#### FINANCIAL ASPECTS

- 1 Candidates will be paid an equipment allowance of Rs.3000 ,  
and Rs. 2000, in case of Foresters and Forest Guards respec-  
tively at the time of joining the School. The amount will be  
deposited with the respective Principal by every nominating  
agency at the time of admission.

Candidates of the Punjab Forest Department will be paid a monthly stipend equivalent to their minimum pay scale by their nominating agencies as per Govt. notification No. FD (SR-I) 1-32/70 (Vol-III) dated 2.6.1972. Other deputing agencies are also advised to pay stipend to their candidates more or less the same rate.

Nominating agencies should pay in advance these expenses for each trainee at the start of the Course to the Principal of the Forest School Concerned.

Agencies other than the Punjab Forest Department are also required to pay in advance the tuition fee of Rs. 8000/- and Rs. 4000/- per candidate for Diploma and Certificate Courses respectively to the Principal of the Forest School.

#### ARRIVAL IN SCHOOLS

The selected candidates will be directed by the nominating authorities/agencies to report the Principal of the respective Forest School on 1st of September of the year. No candidate arriving in schools after 30th of September shall be admitted.

## DOCUMENTS

If at any stage, any of the relevant documents for admission are found to be fabricated or tempered the admission of the student will be cancelled.

## DISCIPLINARY RULES

The objectives of the school are to educate and train nominees of the Punjab Forest Department and nominees from the other provinces to the sub-professional grades for subordinate service, who are responsible and disciplined public servants imbued with desire to improve their professional knowledge and capable to discharge their duties in the field of Forestry.

Keeping these objectives in view, the following rules are laid down to provide an equal opportunity to every student to pursue his academic carrier, build up moral character and balanced personality during his stay in the school.

- In all matters of discipline, the decision of the Principals

will be final.

- All the students are required to wear the school uniform as prescribed by the Principal, from time to time for tours, class room, Games, P.T. and other occasions.
- All the students are required to be punctual and regular in attending classes, P.T., Games and other functions. Requirements of Punctuality in all respect is paramount.
- Students' orderly officer is appointed in each class by rotation on fortnightly basis to maintain close liaison between the school staff and students. He is required to submit a summary of class attendance daily to his class incharge at the end of last period.
- Leave will be granted by Principal under special circumstances only, on payment to the students welfare fund. Over stay after leave vacation or holidays will not be acceptable on any ground. Students on Medical rest recommended by the authorised Medical Officer, must remain in the hostel during treatment till recovery, otherwise it will be considered absence from the school.
- Games and physical training (P.T) are compulsory. The defaulter will be awarded fatigue/extra drill during school hours.
- Every student is required to qualify marathon race within the prescribed time.
- Smoking is strictly prohibited within the premises of school library and dining hall during functions.

- After the completion of course a special confidential report of each student will be sent to the respective Divisional Forest Officer/agency as a record.

#### HOSTEL RULES

- Each student on his arrival will be allotted accommodation in the hostel by the Principal/Hostel Warden, free of rent. All the students must abide by such orders as Principal or the Warden may issue to ensure cleanliness, sanitation and discipline. The students will be personally responsible for the safe custody and up keeping of the hostel furniture and equipment.
- No student will remain absent from the hostel premises after 10 P.M. without the written permission of Hostel Warden or the Principal. A written permission would also be necessary for going out of station.
- No guest or visitors are allowed to stay in the hostel premises under any circumstances.
- Pets, Vehicles, narcotics and weapons are strictly prohibited in the hostel. Musical equipment should not disturb residents, otherwise, will be confiscated.
- Use of electrical appliances such as room heater, water immersion rods and iron etc; are strictly prohibited.

#### MESS RULES

- Every student is required to join the Hostel mess managed by the students themselves. Students shall take their meals in the dining hall/<sup>in</sup> prescribed uniforms between prescribed hours. They will not be allowed to take meals in their living rooms except when permitted by the Hostel Warden.
- A mess advance as prescribed by the Hostel Warden will be payable to the mess secretary appointed by rotation. Monthly

expenses will be announced by the mess secretary during first week of the following month and every student will pay the dues promptly. A student will be charged for mess if his sanctioned leave is less than three days.

- Special cooking for the guest is not allowed in hostel.
- No cooking of any kind is allowed in the living rooms.

### MISCONDUCT

As the training at the school aims producing responsible public servants and conscientious citizens, any improper conduct on the part of the students would be viewed seriously. As a check against misconduct the following punishments are prescribed.

- Warning, censure, physical fatigue and drill.
- Fine
- Deduction of conduct marks.
- Removal from the school.
- The warning, censure physical fatigue, extra drill and fine will be administered by the Principal exclusively on his discretion.
- Deduction of conduct marks and fine will be made by the Principal in consultation with the disciplinary committee, consisting of the Principal, the senior Instructor and the class incharge for serious offences.
- The Principal, may at any time in consultation with the Director, remove any student from the rolls of the school, on any serious breach of the disciplinary rules, misconduct, failure to keep up with the students and training programme, moral turpitude or chronic indebtedness.

The Principal on having decided to remove a student from the school will issue necessary orders under intimation to the respective Divisional Forest Officer/Agency and the parents or

guardian of the student. The student thus punished shall clear all dues, return the books if any issued to him and vacate the school premises within such time as the Principal may decide.

## EXAMINATIONS

### RULES AND REGULATIONS

#### 1. First Term Examination

The first term examination shall be open to the students of the Punjab Forest Schools Ghoragali and Bahawalpur who:

- (a) have been on the roll of the Punjab Forest Schools during the terms preceding the examination, and
- (b) have attended not less than 75 percent of lectures and practicals and the days spent on tour during the term.

#### 2. Second Term Examination

The second term examination shall be open to any candidate mentioned in (a) and (b) <sup>above</sup> provided that he has passed the First Term Examination of the Diploma/Certificate course of the Forest Schools. In case of his failure in the first term examination, he will be allowed to take the second term examination provisionally, and his result of the second term examination shall not be declared if he fails in the first term supplementary examination.

#### 3. Third Term Examination

The third term examination shall be open to any candidate mentioned in (a) and (b) <sup>above</sup> provided that he has passed the second term examination for the Diploma course of Forest Schools Ghoragali and Bahawalpur. In case of his failure in the second term examination, he will be allowed to take the third term examination provisionally and his result of the third term examination shall not be declared if he fails in the second term supplementary examination.

#### Fourth Term Examination

1.4. -- The fourth term examination shall be open to any candidate mentioned in (a) and (b) <sup>above</sup> provided that he has passed the third term examination for the Diploma course of Punjab Forest Schools Ghoragali and Bahawalpur. In case of his failure in third term examination his result of the fourth term examination shall not be declared if he fails in the third term supplementary examination.

-- If any candidate fails in the fourth term examination, his final cumulative result shall not be declared until he qualifies the fourth term supplementary examination.

The final examination in theory and practicals shall be held towards the end of the courses in the month of August, and :  
result <sup>will be</sup> /announced before close of the month, so that the trainees found successful may join their respective Forest Divisions on the 1st of September.

3. Only one chance of appearing in the supplementary examination shall be allowed and the students failing in the supplementary shall not be permitted to appear in any subsequent examination.

4. The question papers for diploma and certificate courses at both the schools shall be the same, and Director, P.F.R.I Faisalabad will perform the responsibility of a Controller of examinations for both the schools.

#### GRADING-MERIT CUM SENIORITY LIST.

-- The grading of the successful students at the end of the courses will be decided according to the total number of marks obtained which will normally determine the inter seniority of the successful candidates in the service in their respective Forest Divisions. If a student fails in any subject and passes in the supplementary examination, his merit position will be

decided by the Principal of the school, by taking into account the marks he obtained, in the attempt in which he had failed.

### HONOUR CERTIFICATE

-- Honour certificate is awarded to the out-standing students of both the Diploma and Certificate classes, obtaining 80% or above marks in aggregate.
